(UNDER SECTION 13) -

The powers conferred upon me under section 13 of the Public Order, Act. 1963, I PRINTE MBILINI PRIME MINISTER OF THE KINGDOM OF SWAZILAND hereby designate the mass stay away called by the Swaziland Federation of Trade Unious to start on the 17th July, 1995 it any five themselver, to be a Boycott as it has the effect of -

- ininging into harred or contempt, exciting disaffention against or undermining the lawful authority of Swaziland Government;
- (b) endangering public Order; and
- (c) mdangering the economic life of Swaziland.

Entire, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me under the said section 13, I hereby specify a region noise designated Boycott the following actions to be likely to further such Boycott -

- (a) the miawful withdrawal of employees services from their employers including essential services as defined under the Employment Act, 1980;
- the miawful interference with and public disruption of public transport toerations:
- in the miswful interference with members of the public in their normal business and operations:
- d; the mlawful interference with the life and property of members of the public and the state;
- te miawful interference with and disruption of normal business operations;
- the uniawful interference and disruption of the educational system;
- (g. the miawful interference with any person doing any act which may lawfully be done or any person omitting to do anything which may lawfully be omitted to be done.

This Notice small operate with immediate effect until further notice.

⁽³⁾ Any person, with intent to further a designated boycott who by word of mouth publicly, or by making a publication (as defined in sub-section (9)), advises, induces or persuades or attempts to advise, induce or persuade any person or class of persons to take any action which has been specified in relation to such boycott, shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to imprisonment not exceeding six months.
